CLUE #1 – Your card can be Portrait or Landscape

Designer Series Paper measurements below are for a Portrait card

1. Cardstock for base – 5 ½" x 8 ½", score at 4 ¼"
2. Designer Series Paper (DSP) – 3 7/8" x 2 ½", 3 7/8" x 3" (Consider using the backside or another pattern when you are cutting these two pieces)
3. Cardstock to match DSP:
  - a. ½" x 3 7/8"
  - b. Scrap for Matt layer
  - c. 4" x 5 ¼"
4. Basic White – 3 7/8" x 5 1/8" — for the card front layer
  - a. Large scrap — for stamping/focal image if needed
  - b. Small scrap – for greeting layer
  - c. 4" x 5 1/4" — for the inside *only if using colored cardstock for the card base*
5. Stamps – I recommend a fairly large image stamp for this card plus a greeting
6. Ink, coloring tools if needed
7. Adhesive (including Dimensional and Liquid glue is helpful on this card)
8. Embellishments
9. Paper Snips, Paper Trimmer with scoring blade or Simply Scored tool,
  - a. Die Cutting Machine

#### OTHER OPTIONS TO CONSIDER:

Instead of die cutting stamp images, you could fussy cut images from Designer Series Papers

Instead of just stamping on white cardstock, you could choose to heat emboss on colored cardstock

## CLUE #2

Add colored cardstock that measures 4" x 5 ¼" to card base with adhesive

## CLUE #3

Add the 3 7/8" x 2 1/2" DSP on the top of the Basic White layer (using the Liquid glue is helpful)

## CLUE #4

Add the 3 7/8" x 3" DSP on the bottom of the Basic White layer

Note: the DSP layers should overlap a little

## CLUE #5

Add colored cardstock that measures ½" x 3 7/8" to the seam of the two DSP layers with adhesive

## CLUE #6

Now add your completed Basic White/DSP layer to the front of your card base with adhesive (liquid glue is best since you only have a 1/16" border)

## CLUE #7

Create your focal point of the card front by stamping, coloring, and cutting out an image using your scrap Basic White, or use scissors and fussy-cut an image from DSP. I encourage you to go Rogue and maybe cut more images!

## CLUE #8

Add the focal image(s) to the card front with Dimensionals, leaving room for your greeting layer

## CLUE #9

Stamp/heat emboss greeting.

## CLUE #10

Create a MATT layer for your greeting layer and adhere the two together with adhesive. If you chose to emboss your greeting on colored cardstock you may not need a MATT layer

## Clue #11

Add greeting/Matt layer to card front with Dimensionals

## CLUE #12

Add embellishments to card front

## CLUE #13

If your card base is colored cardstock, add the Basic White layer to the inside.

Stamp or add DSP to inside of card
